

Information on compensation for disadvantages

in respect of examinations (Nachteilsausgleich)

Content of doctor's certificates /psychologist'reports

The medical practitioner's certificate or psychologist's report should not normally be more than two years old. The following information should be provided:

- name and date of birth of patient
- date of diagnosis
- diagnosis (voluntary information)
- description of the exam-relevant impairments relating to the respective examination
 performance for which compensation is being requested (e.g. limited capacity to
 concentrate, general limitations on ability to cope, e.g. with coursework, inability to write,
 visual impairment, etc.). The description should enable the University to decide on the
 specific nature of compensation measures.
- description of the specific development of the disability/chronic disease (e.g. stable, progressive, degressive). A long-term condition should be indicated in the doctor's certificate.

This is a doctor's certificate and not a comprehensive medical report. The certificate / report will not be accepted without the stamp, name and signature of the issuing person.
